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Membership

- To join the club, visit our website <u>www.wbrf.co.za</u> and under 'downloads', find the application form.
- Please download the 'Club Rules' and and ensure you understand them.
- Membership to the South African Model Aircraft Association (SAMAA) is compulsory. Application for membership can be found at <u>http://www.samaa.co.za:89/</u>

- In addition, we have a weather station at the field. The weather info can be found on the <u>www.wbrf.co.za</u> website.

Flying field

- Directions to the field are given on the WBRF website.
- The gate is locked with a combination lock. Once your membership has been confirmed, you will be supplied with the code.
- Flying takes place 7 days a week. Normally, members can be found at the field shortly after sunrise to about 10:00. This is the part of the day when the wind speed is usually low and flying is fun.
- There are no toilets, water or electricity at the field. Bring a flask of coffee and snacks.
- It is advisable not to fly on your own for safety and security reasons.
- NO OPEN FIRES ARE ALLOWED.
- A board with EMERGENCY contact numbers can be found at the field.

Flight Simulators

- A flight simulator that runs on your PC or Laptop will greatly speed up the process of learning to fly. Although you should only fly your model under supervision, a flight simulator will allow you to become accustomed to the movement of the joysticks and the effect they have.
- Being proficient on a flight simulator does not mean that you can fly a real model aircraft. Please do not try.

Learning to fly

- Please do not try and fly your aircraft on your own if you have never flown before.
 - \checkmark You will probably crash.
 - \checkmark You are a danger to yourself and other pilots.
 - ✓ It is against SAMAA and WBRF rules.
- The club has a list of instructors who will assist you in learning to fly. This is a free service and has many benefits
 - ✓ The instructor will check your aircraft for air worthiness and help in setting up the radio.
 - ✓ They will assist you in learning to fly and offer many valuable hints and tips.
 - \checkmark You will be evaluated each step of the way to competency.
- Please contact one of the instructors from the list and make arrangements with him.
- Briefly the process will be;
 - ✓ The instructor will check the aircraft for air worthiness and ensure that the radio is correctly set-up.
 - ✓ The instructor will test fly the aircraft and 'trim' the aircraft for straight and level flight.
 - ✓ He will do the take-off, give the radio to you and allow you to fly and then he will land the aircraft.
 - ✓ As your skills improve, you will do the take-off and flying. The instructor will land the aircraft until he feels you are competent enough to do the landings.
 - ✓ You will continue flying under the supervision of an instructor until you are ready to take your SOLO test.

<u>Modes</u>

• Transmitters are referred to as Mode 1 or Mode 2. This refers to the layout and functions of the joysticks.





• The quickest way of identifying your radio's mode is to identify the throttle stick. It is the one that has a ratchet action and will move from to to bottom and stay there. All the other sticks have a self-centering action.

Proficiency Tests

- To be allowed to fly without supervision, you will need to pass a Proficiency test.
- The basic test is the SOLO rating. A copy of the SAMAA Proficiency Booklet can be downloaded from: <u>http://www.samaa.org.za/docs/info_7bKxhgxWt878wT6.pdf</u>
- Once you feel you are ready, ask your instructor to arrange for you to be tested.

Pre-flight checks

- Many a crash has resulted from a failure to perform pre-flight checks. Your instructor will take you through these;
 - \checkmark Check your batteries to ensure they are fully charged.
 - ✓ Check the aircraft for mechanical damage including;
 - ✓ Engine securely mounted
 - ✓ Tug each control surface to ensure that the hinge mechanisms are sound.
 - \checkmark Undercarriage secure.
 - \checkmark Do a radio range check.
 - ✓ Check each control for proper operation and direction of movement.
 - ✓ Throttle
 - ✓ Ailerons
 - ✓ Elevator
 - ✓ Flaps (if fitted)
 - \checkmark Fully fueled if powered by an i.c engine.

SAFETY, SAFETY AND SAFETY

- The hobby can be potentially dangerous and a few common sense precautions must be taken.
 - \checkmark Do not start engines in the pit area.
 - ✓ Use the designated "starting poles" to start engines.
 - ✓ Keep fingers away from a spinning propellers.
 - ✓ Stand behind aircraft being started or with running engines. If a prop comes off, it can cause injury.
 - ✓ Only fly in the designated fly-zones. These are clearly shown on a board at the field.
 - \checkmark It is advisable to never fly alone.
 - ✓ Communicate clearly with the other pilots when on, near or crossing the runway.
